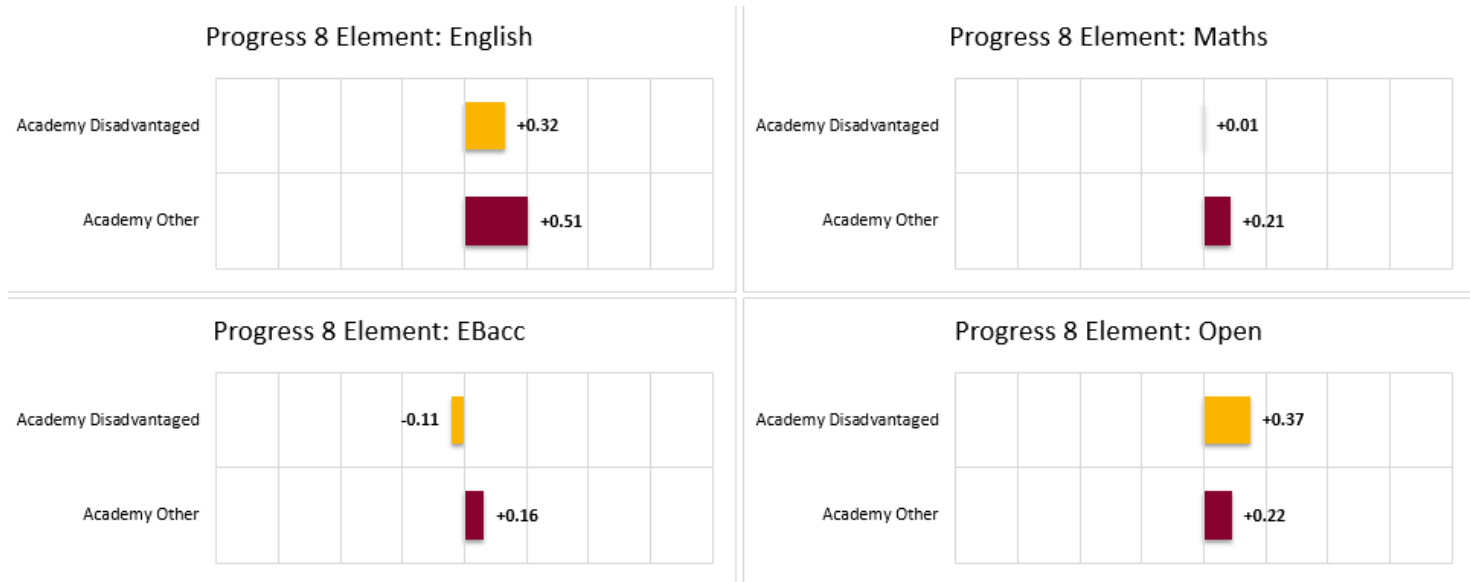


Pupil Premium Impact Assessment – Secondary Phase

2017/18



The strategies we have adopted over the last academic year are closing the gap between our pupil premium and non- pupil premium students in the open basket subjects. The progress 8 score in particular demonstrates this.

The strategies that have had most impact in 2017/8 and have provided the best value for money from the Pupil Premium funding have included;

- Extensive work from our attendance team with PP students given priority tracked daily closing the attendance gap between PP and Non-PP students by the first term of Summer PP students' attendance in Yr11 was in line with Non-PP peers.
- Introduction of "Bridge" targeted intervention and social and emotional support can be provided for students whenever it is required.
- Regular RAG meetings where we discuss every Year 11 student and ensure any intervention is evaluated appropriate. Both PP students and our more-able disadvantaged are key cohorts that are discussed regularly in SLT.
- Targeted and early interventions for PP students, including after school "catch-up" sessions.
- Tracking of PP students throughout Year 11 and immediate interventions to close any gaps across the curriculum especially with HAP PP girls, where the gap was wider last year.
- Enhanced enrichment programme including peripatetic music teachers providing extra-curricular opportunities and experiences.
